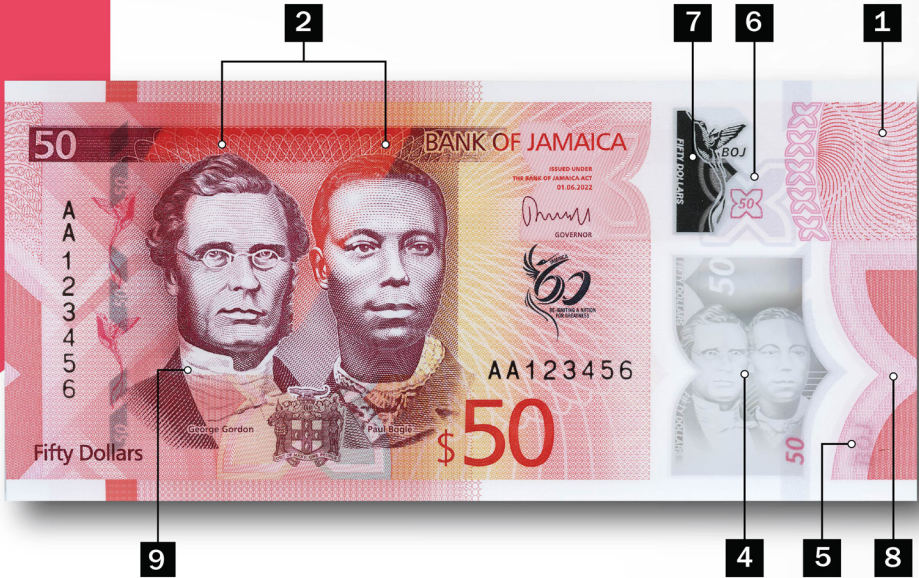


This new series of banknotes is comprised of six denominations, given the introduction of the \$2000 note. The upgrade of Jamaica's banknotes is aimed at achieving the following:

- 1** Enhancing the security features of the banknotes to combat counterfeiting
- 2** Enhancing the tactile features for the visually impaired
- 3** Ensuring a clear distinction among the different denominations
- 4** Providing cost savings to Bank of Jamaica

In upgrading the banknotes, the opportunity was created to honour all our national heroes and deceased prime ministers who were not featured on the banknotes. A portrait of these persons will appear on the new banknotes and are paired contemporaneously based on their contribution to Jamaica within the categories of "Freedom Fighters, Black Empowerment and Pan-Africanism, Fathers of the Nation and Nation Builder". Notably, the Rt. Excellent Marcus Garvey, Jamaica's first national hero, appears as a single subject.

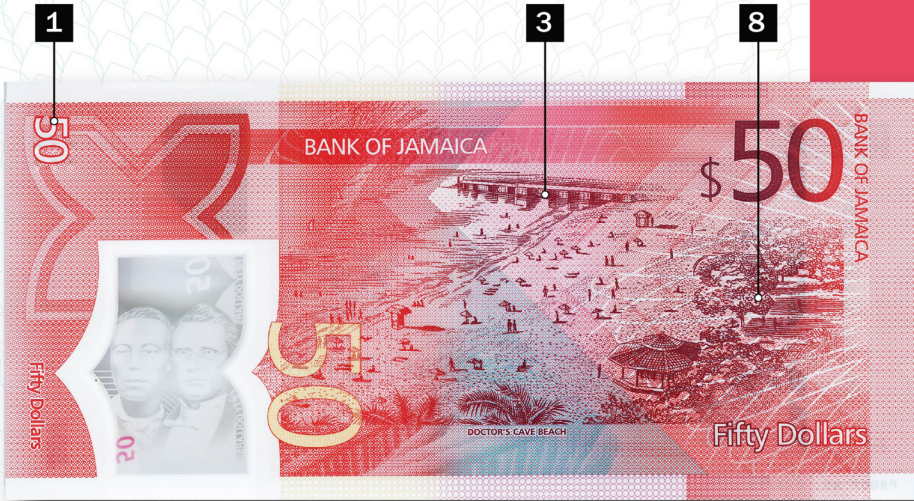

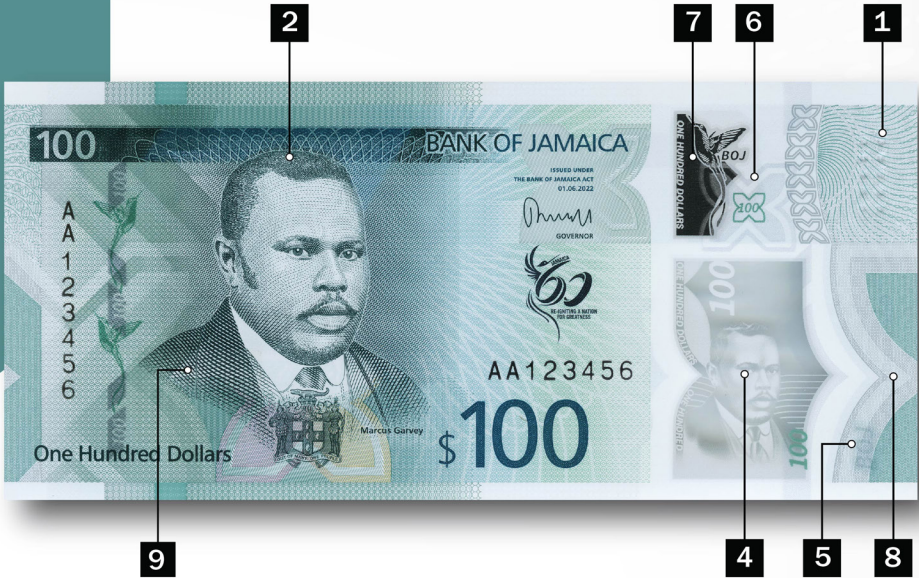

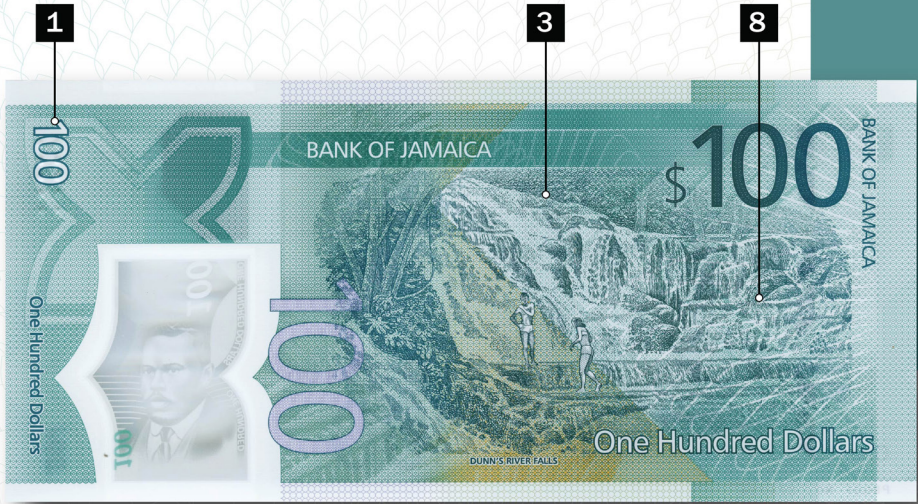

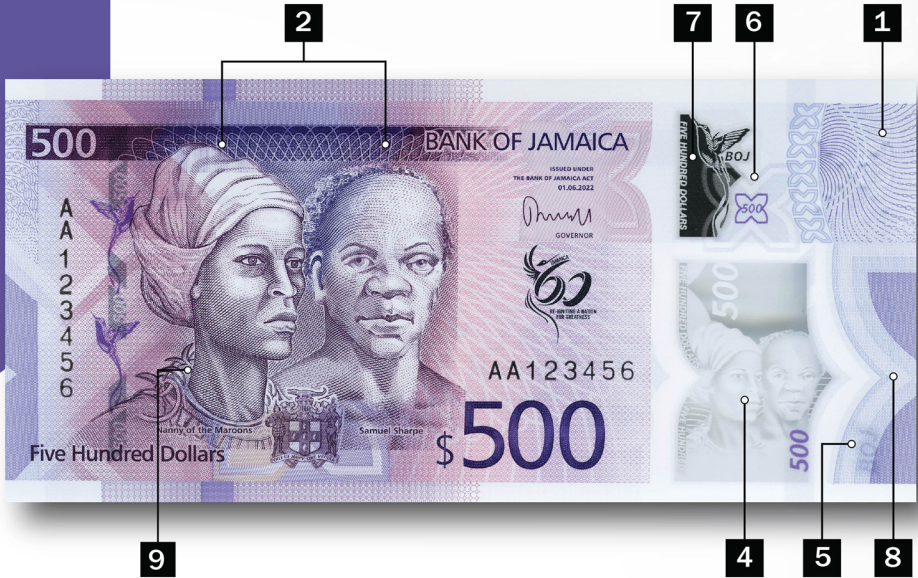

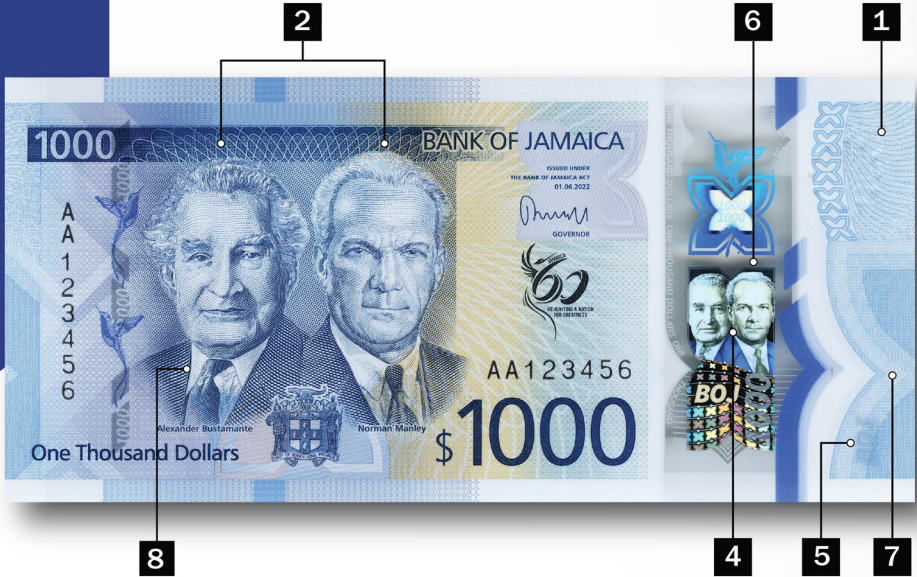

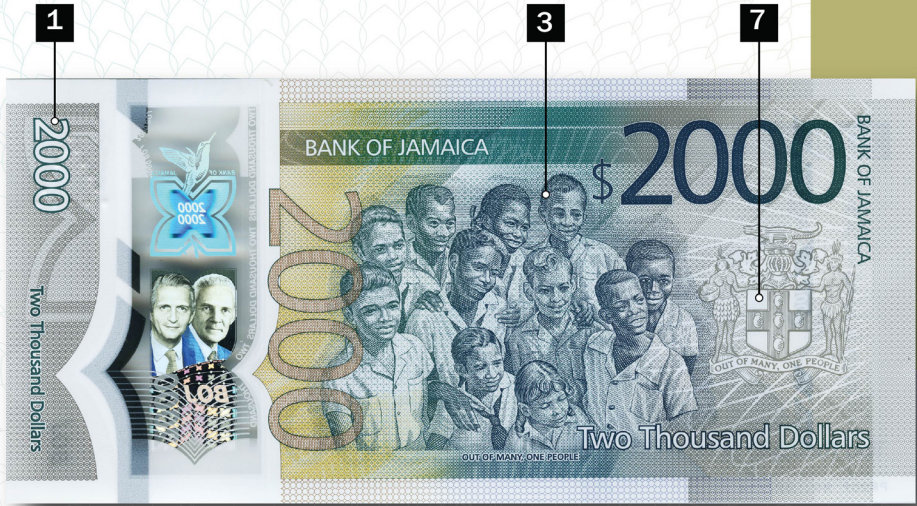

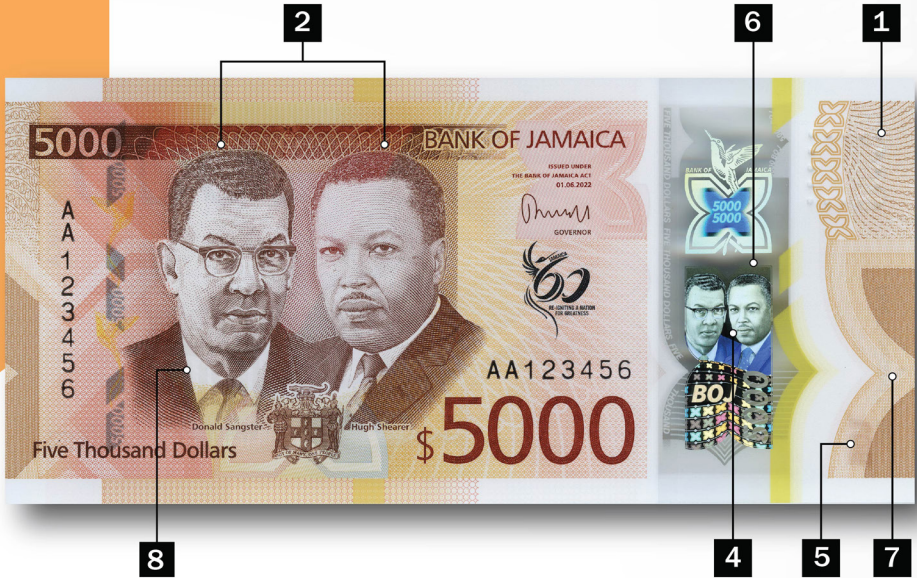
